



# **Concussion pathways**

New Calgary Zone pathways are now available to guide the assessment, diagnosis and management of concussion in adults.

The <u>acute concussion pathway</u> is designed for patients in the initial four weeks following injury. That includes geriatric patients and those who are pregnant.

If the patient is still symptomatic at more than 12 weeks post-injury – unless it's the first presentation – a second pathway is available: The <u>persisting post-concussion symptoms</u> <u>pathway</u>. If symptoms persist beyond three months, referral for specialized assessment and/or interdisciplinary concussion services/clinics may be indicated.

**Palliative care:** Updated palliative care access pathways for pediatric and adult patients are now available on Specialist Link. The <u>adult pathway</u> provides links and referral information for the palliative care consult service and home care, while the <u>pediatric pathway</u> references the children's hospice and palliative care service – in addition to consults – and home care.

**Reminder for gynecology referrals**: Primary care providers in the Calgary area are advised to send gynecology referrals directly to the clinic or surgeon of their choice. # **Compensation model info**

# **Reminder: Document, results routing**

AHS has implemented changes to the electronic delivery of clinical documents and results from Connect Care to electronic medical records.

The change aims to resolve most of the duplication that community providers have experienced since the launch of Connect Care. It will also expand eDelivery to send more letters to EMRs and ensure clinical information is more consistently delivered to providers based on the preferences they've provided.
