

Palliative care access

Updated palliative care access pathways for pediatric and adult patients are now available on Specialist Link.

The pathways, which list routine, urgent and emergent options, break down both urban and rural choices for referring providers. The <u>adult pathway</u> provides links and referral information for the palliative care consult service and home care, while the <u>pediatric pathway</u> references the children's hospice and palliative care service – in addition to consults – and home care.

Gynecology referrals: Primary care providers in the Calgary area are advised to send gynecology referrals directly to the clinic or surgeon of their choice, effective immediately, after the Facilitated Access to Specialized Treatment (FAST) initiative paused its central intake program for that specialty.

A list of local gynecology clinics can be <u>downloaded here</u>. Gynecology tele-advice is available via <u>specialistlink.ca</u>. Alberta Netcare eReferral – <u>eConsult</u> is also available.

Tele-advice service closures: Urology and orthopedic surgery tele-advice are no longer available via Specialist Link. For orthopedic surgery questions, providers are asked to direct questions to the RAAPID consultation and advice line. Urology non-urgent requests can go through FAST. Emergent calls can be directed to the urologist on call. The patient can also be directed to the Rockyview General Hospital emergency department, at the discretion of the provider. Please refer to the <u>orthopedics access pathway</u> and the <u>urology access pathway</u>.

Document, results routing

Effective Monday, January 27, AHS will implement changes to the electronic delivery of clinical documents and results from Connect Care to electronic medical records.

The change aims to resolve most of the duplication that community providers have experienced since the launch of Connect Care. It will also expand eDelivery to send more letters to EMRs, and ensure clinical information is more consistently delivered to providers based on the preferences they've provided.

Routing will take into account provider-patient associations in the care team in Connect Care, as well as the preferences of providers. For providers who work in Connect Care at AHS and in the community, in most cases, results will go to Inbasket only if their primary address is an AHS location.
