



# Demystifying fibromyalgia

### **Pathway updates**

Three popular Specialist Link pathways have been updated to reflect the latest evidence, treatment and referral options.

The Calgary Zone <u>headache and migraine pathway</u>, which focuses on migraine management in non-pregnant adults and details the many possible steps physicians and teams can take when managing migraines, now includes a list of <u>family practice clinics</u> in the local area that take referrals to help reduce wait times.

The <u>neurology access pathway</u> has also been updated to reflect recent referral options, while the <u>alcohol use disorder pathway</u> has been amended to incorporate changes recommended during a recent Zone webinar.

### Fax routing for Connect Care

An interim routing solution is available for mixed content community providers who have limited, intermittent work in a Connect Care context and don't want their results and documentation sent to Connect Care In Basket.

Those providers can request their default communication method for results and documentation be changed from Connect Care In Basket to fax, either for all information currently sent to their Connect Care In Basket that can be faxed, or for diagnostic cardiology results only. By enabling fax redirect, the duplicate Connect Care In Basket result would be sent by fax instead.

Those considering this solution should be aware of the potential for increased workload for administrative staff in community clinics. Please reference the <u>FAQ</u> (login required).
