

## Last chance to register: Infectious disease webinar

It's your last chance to register for next week's Calgary Zone webinar, which will examine the fall respiratory virus situation in the Calgary area.

On Monday, November 18, from 6–8 p.m., Dr. Jim Kellner will lead a session on influenza, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) and COVID-19. In addition, Dr. Christine Luelo will lead her usual *Hot Topics* segment and there will be an update on AHS bariatric clinic process changes.

Dr. Paul Petrasek will lead a discussion about the December launch of three new surgical specialties via the Facilitated Access to Specialist Treatment (FAST) central access program: Plastic surgery, neurosurgery and oral maxillofacial surgery. <u>Register</u>.

## New pathway: Adolescent abnormal uterine bleeding

A new pathway has been unveiled for adolescents under 18 years of age who are suffering from abnormal uterine bleeding (AUB).

The pathway applies to any female who has menarche. It aims to facilitate the prompt management of AUB – bleeding that occurs outside of the normal 24- to 38-day pattern – in the medical home. It includes evidence-based diagnosis, investigations and management, as well as guidelines for when to make a referral or seek non-urgent advice. <u>Download the pathway</u>.

**Tele-advice calls:** The turnaround time for Specialist Link tele-advice return calls has transitioned from one hour to two hours. This change is part of efforts to ensure consistent and reliable service to primary care teams across the Calgary area.

## Specialties set to be added to FAST

The FAST central access and intake program is expanding next month to include three new specialties.

Effective Monday, December 2, referrals for neurosurgery, oral maxillofacial surgery and plastic surgery will go through FAST (fax to 1-833-627-7023). That is in addition to general surgery, gynecology, orthopedic surgery (except for oncology and pediatric orthopaedics, as well as spine surgery), urology and vascular surgery, specialties that are already part of the program. The planned launch of otolaryngology has been delayed until further notice.

**Orthopedics:** Four rapid access clinics have been established in the Calgary area with the aim of reducing wait times for patients referred for orthopedic surgery consultation. Patients may be directed to rapid access clinics to reduce wait times.

**Gynecology referrals:** Due to long wait times for routine gynecology consultations, referrals submitted via FAST may be sent to clinics in areas surrounding Calgary for faster processing. That could include clinics in High River or Canmore, for example. If your patient is not able to travel to appointments, please include that information in the referral letter or form.

## **MAPS** town hall

A town hall will be held next week to provide an update on the Modernizing Alberta's Primary Health Care System (MAPS) initiative.

**Community health centres funding:** The Alex Community Health Centre and CUPS Calgary Society are among the community health centres that are set to receive \$30 million in government funding over two years.

**Rural funding:** Plans have been announced to invest \$12 million over two years into two grants aimed at improving team-based primary health care. The deadline to submit an expression of interest is Friday, November 29. <u>More information</u>.

To make a change, call 1-877-311-4300 and select option 1 for clinical applications, followed by 1 for Connect Care. ## Virtual chronic pain program

The Alberta Virtual Chronic Pain Program can help support patients living with chronic pain and the primary care providers who care for them.

Launched in April 2024, it can be accessed through clinician referral and self-referral. It includes non-pharmacologic chronic pain care via a multidisciplinary team and help with system navigation. It also offers education on chronic pain management to physicians, nurse practitioners and teams.

### **COVID-19 testing**

Free test kits for COVID-19 rapid antigen testing are no longer available. Tests for personal use can be purchased at some pharmacies and online. Alberta continues to provide laboratory-based, provincially funded COVID-19 polymerase chain reaction testing for patients at risk of severe outcomes to support their clinical care and for the purpose of outbreak management in high-risk facilities. A COVID-19 PCR test must be ordered by a physician or nurse practitioner.

### Reports for second trimester prenatal risk assessment

Paper copies of reports for Second Trimester Prenatal Risk Assessment will no longer be mailed to healthcare providers. The change will eliminate duplicate reporting. <u>More information</u>.
