# Specialties to be added to FAST

The FAST central access and intake program is expanding next week to include three new specialties.

Effective Monday, December 2, referrals for neurosurgery, oral maxillofacial surgery and plastic surgery will go through FAST (fax to 1-833-627-7023). That is in addition to general surgery, gynecology, orthopedic surgery (except for oncology and pediatric orthopaedics, as well as spine surgery), urology and vascular surgery. The planned launch of otolaryngology has been delayed until further notice.

If you have not already, please update your records to include the Calgary Zone FAST fax number.

The referral process and link to the referral form are now included on the pathways:

Neurosurgery: <u>Referral pathway</u>

- Oral maxillofacial surgery: Referral pathway
- Plastic surgery: Referral pathway

**Gynecology referrals:** Due to long wait times for routine gynecology consultations, referrals submitted via FAST may be sent to clinics in areas surrounding Calgary for faster processing. That could include clinics in High River or Canmore, for example. If your patient is not able to travel to appointments, please include that information in the referral letter or form.

### MAPS town hall

**Tele-advice calls:** The turnaround time for Specialist Link tele-advice return calls has transitioned from one hour to two hours. This change is part of efforts to ensure consistent and reliable service to primary care teams across the Calgary area.

The Alberta Find a Doctor (AFAD) team has launched separate patient and provider surveys to help shape the future of the website.

Launched in 2019 by Alberta's Primary Care Networks and operated with support from Alberta Health grant funding, it attracted 1.1 million visits last year and aims to make it quicker and easier for Albertans to find a family doctor, nurse practitioner or team. The website relies on both PCNs and providers to help keep listings as accurate and up-to-date as possible.

The AFAD team is exploring ways of improving the website for users, PCNs and providers. To take part in the surveys, please:
